The aim of Marie-Skłodowska Curie Individual Fellowships is to enhance the creative and innovative potential of experienced researchers (of any nationality) wishing to diversify their individual competence in terms of skill acquisition through advanced training, international and intersectoral mobility. Eligibility criteria

Applicants must comply with the Marie Skłodowska Curie Individual European Fellowships eligibility criteria:

- The applicant must be an Experienced Researcher: s/he must be in possession of a doctoral degree *or* four years full-time equivalent research experience at the deadline for the submission of proposals (10 September 2015);
- The applicant must not have resided or carried out the main activity (work, studies, etc.) in the United Kingdom for more than 12 months in the 3 years immediately prior to the deadline for submission of proposals;
- Note that any applicant may submit only one proposal to the call for Marie Skłodowska Curie Individual Fellowships

If eligible to apply, register your interest by forwarding your CV (2 pages maximum) and a covering letter explaining why you are a strong candidate for the fellowship to Professor Cahal Mc Laughlin, School of Creative Arts, QUB, c.mclaughlin@qub.ac.uk or Inmaculada Higuera, SSH H2020 contact point at QUB, i.higuera@qub.ac.uk. Your CV and letter will be reviewed and, if accepted, you will be invited to prepare and submit a joint application to the Marie Skłodowska Curie Individual European Fellowship programme. You will be supported by our dedicated EU Research Development team to increase your chance of success. If the joint Marie Skłodowska-Curie application is successful, you will be appointed as a researcher at Queen's for the duration of the fellowship.
